1. Approach God With Confidence as You Pray (1 John 5:13-15)

- We Can Be Confident He is the Source for Eternal Life
- 6X: We see the phrase, "We know."

May know (είδῆτε). Not perceive (γινώσκειν), but know with settled and absolute knowledge. ¹

¹⁴ And we are <u>confident</u> that he hears us whenever we ask for anything that pleases him. (according to his will) ¹⁵ And since we know he hears us when we make our requests, we also know that he will give us what we ask for, 1 John 5:14-15

<u>Parresia</u>: Confidence, freedom of speech, boldness or openness, He Hears our prayers (1 John 2:28, 3:21, 4:17,5:14)

- We pray, according to the will of God.
- √ To have faith in Jesus

But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask for anything you want, and it will be granted! John 15:7

You didn't choose me. I chose you. I appointed you to go and produce lasting fruit, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask for, using my name. John 15:16

✓ To confess my Sin

¹⁸ If I had not confessed the sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened. Psalm 66:18

✓ To bring glory to God

²¹ Dear children, keep away from anything that might take God's place in your hearts. 1 John 5:21

√ To align me with God's purposes

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, <u>your will be done</u> on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:9-10, NIV

 Right way (I need you) Right heart, persistence in it. His time, his will, Keep on asking, seeking, knocking, Matthew 7

³ And even when you ask, you don't get it because **your motives are all wrong**—you want only what will give you pleasure. James 4:3

2. Approach God with Confidence on Behalf of Others (1 John 5:16-17)

pagha`, "to make intercession"; originally "to strike upon," or "against"; then in a good sense, "to assail anyone with petitions," "to urge," and when on behalf of another, "to intercede" (Ruth 1:16; Jeremiah 7:16; 27:18; Job 21:15; Genesis 23:8; Isaiah 53:12; Jeremiah 36:25). A similar idea is found in enteuxis, used as "petition," and in the New Testament "intercession." The English word is derived from Latin intercedo, "to come between," which strangely has the somewhat opposed meanings of "obstruct" and "to interpose on behalf of" a person, and finally "to intercede." ²

³⁰ "I looked for someone who might rebuild the wall of righteousness that guards the land. I searched for someone to stand in the gap in the wall so I wouldn't have to destroy the land, but I found no one. Ezekiel 22:30

- Intercession: Bringing God into the situation or the relationship. We ask God to see the world through spiritual eyes.
- We need to treat sin with all seriousness!

5:17 not every sin leads to death: Those that do not involve ultimate apostasy can end in repentance and restoration (see Jas 5:20).³ There is a clear distinction between A Christ Follower and one who is not.

3. Approach God with Confidence in Confessing Sin (1 John 5:18-21)

- We know we can not continue in sin. (Vs. 18)
- We know we need to seek Him for protection (vs. 19)

¹⁵ My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. John 17:15 (NIV)

13 And don't let us yield to temptation, but rescue us from the evil one. Matthew 6:13

We know We are given a unique understanding to know the will of God. (Vs. 20)
